School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

August 18, 2014

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2013-2014 educational progress for the Boyne City Alternative Ed. Boyne Valley Campus (now called the Morgan-Shaw School). The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Cody Wilcox for assistance.

The AER is available for you to review electronically by visiting the following web site www.boyne.k12.mi.us or you may review a copy in the principal's office at your child's school.

The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state.

Our school has not been given a label because it is a SEE school.

For 2013-2014, Boyne City Alternative High School was once again approved for Shared Educational Entity Status. What this means is all state test score are sent back to our students district of residence for reporting purposes. Also, if a school tests ten or less students that data will not be reported on the Annual Education Report, which is the case for Boyne City Alternative High School. We appreciate the continued support of parents, staff and our community in this effort.

The biggest challenge we face here at Boyne City Alternative is taking a population of students who come from different educational backgrounds and different districts and finding what gaps exist in their schooling. A key initiative we have taken is pretesting students so we have a better understanding of what content needs to be covered at an individual or group level.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. Our Alternative High School is open to students in grades 9-12. However, there is an application process that must take place before the student can be enrolled. Boyne City Schools welcome students who reside within any district that has signed our cooperative agreement.
2. Boyne has maintained school improvement goals in the areas math and reading as well as parent involvement. Progress toward the goals is monitored and goals are adjusted yearly.
3. Boyne City Alternative students have access to specialized programs that are offered in the Char-Em ISD as well as through the district.
4. Boyne City Alternative High School follows the Michigan Department of Education curriculum, available for viewing at <http://www.michigan.gov/mde>. District department teams and teachers coordinate the efforts of K-12 subject area curriculum committees to review, evaluate, develop and write curriculum and assessments. This ongoing, cyclical process includes research, analysis of current practice, selection of appropriate resources, and implementation. These same department teams also meet to assure alignment across (vertical articulation) and within grade levels (horizontal articulation). Vertical articulation addresses the transition between one grade or subject level to the next. The district curriculum is aligned with the Michigan Department of Education Grade Level Content Expectations and Michigan Merit Curriculum.
5. Boyne City Alternative is a SEE school and therefore scores are sent to students' home districts.
6. 4% of students were represented by parents at parent-teacher conferences.
7. Boyne City Alternative offers advanced learning opportunities' however students do not take advantage of these opportunities.
 - a. 0 dual enrolment students
 - b. Numerous college equivalent courses available through online programs(AP/IB)
 - c. 0 students enrolled in college equivalent courses (AP/IB)
 - d. 0 receiving college credit

We are proud of the work our students are doing. Although many of our

students face personal struggles they continue to persevere and work towards earning a high school diploma. Our staff continues to improve our building culture and curriculum and each year we see improvements in our students socially and educationally. Thank you to the parents and community that support our alternative high school and its continued growth.
